Arkansas	All restaurant service staff and patrons must wear a face mask and gloves. Patrons may take off the mask when the food or drink is served. Face mask is an option for staff who do not contact with patrons.	Residents are encouraged to wear a cloth mask in public where the 6-foot distance is difficult to maintain.
California	Employers should train and encourage employees to wear masks at the workplace. Employers in the grocery industry should provide face masks for workers who regularly contact with the public. Certain counties such as those in the Bay Area or Los Angeles mandate people to wear face masks when they go out in public or enter essential businesses.	Maintain physical distance or blocks between employees and customers.
Colorado	Everyone should wear a mask when out in public. Employees should wear a mask when working.	If possible, masks should be provided to employees.
Connecticut	Residents should wear a face covering in public whenever close contact is unavoidable. Essential business workers must wear masks or material that covers their mouth and nose at all times while at work. Employers must provide masks or the materials to make them.	
Delaware	Wear face coverings in public, including in grocery stores, convenience stores, pharmacies, doctor's offices, and on public transportation. Employees should wear a face covering while working in areas open to the public and in areas where social distancing is difficult to maintain. Employers should provide employees face coverings.	
D.C.	Wear masks or face coverings when engaging in essential and minimum basic operations of business while in the presence of other persons and essential travel if social distancing cannot be maintained. The requirements apply to individuals over age of 9. Essential businesses employees and independent contractors must wear masks. Businesses must provide masks to employees.	The mayor publicly stated employees, customers, and visitors of hotels, grocery stores and other retail food sellers and taxis, ride-sharing companies, or private transportation providers should wear a mask for face covering. However, the following ordinance only states hotels and stores must simply post signage instructing guests and customers to wear masks or mouth coverings.

Employer should offer instruction on proper use of masks and PPE.	Wear cloth face coverings in public where social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.
Louisiana	All employees of a business who have contact with the public must wear a mask.	Wear a cloth face covering in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.
Maine	Wear cloth face coverings in public where social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.	
Maryland	Face covering needs to be worn in food and retail establishments and when taking public transportation until the state of emergency is lifted.	
Massachusetts	Residents over age of 2 must wear face coverings in public settings and on public transportation. A business may decline entry of a customer who refuses to wear a face covering for non-medical reasons.	
Michigan	Michigan residents who can medically tolerate a face covering are required to wear a covering in public. All businesses should provide employees with masks to wear while working.	
Minnesota	Retail workers who may have limited interaction with customers for purposes of curbside or outdoor pickup or delivery must wear a non-medical cloth mask.	Use cloth face coverings in public settings where social distancing is difficult to maintain.
Mississippi	Certain cities mandate wearing face masks in public.	Wear non-medical grade masks or homemade cloth masks when shopping, running errands, or otherwise away from home.
Missouri	Some local governments have face covering requirements.	Wear cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.

Included are agriculture, appliance and furniture showrooms, auto dealerships, banks and financial services, personal care services, restaurants and food and drink establishments, general office operations, retail and consumer services, and transportation, couriers, and warehousing.</p>	Grocery employers are recommended to require employees to wear face coverings. Grocery customers are recommended to use an improvised face covering.

New Mexico	Employers must provide employees face coverings and require their use in the workplace.	Wear a cloth face covering in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.
New York	Anyone over the age of 2 should wear face masks while in public where social distancing is not possible like public transportation. Essential businesses employers should provide face coverings for their employees.	
North Carolina	Some local governments require to wear face coverings.	Retail employers are encouraged to educate employees who come in close contact with customers and other employees on proper use of face coverings and encourage to use them.
North Dakota	Health care service employees should wear face masks.	Generally recommended to wear facial coverings in public where social distancing is not possible.
Ohio	Employers and employees should wear cloth face coverings, unless it is not advised for health reasons, employee is working alone in an enclosed workspace, or there is a practical reason one cannot be worn.	
Oklahoma	Some cities make it mandatory to wear cloth masks within city limits.	None
Oregon	Employers may encourage or require employee to use face coverings. If employers require employees to use face coverings, they must provide face coverings for employees.	Wear cloth masks or face coverings in public.
Pennsylvania	Essential business employers should provide employees face masks and require them to wear the masks. Customers at these businesses must wear masks while on the premises or be denied entry.	
Rhode Island	Employees of essential businesses are required to wear cloth face coverings unless that employee can continually maintain at least six feet of distance from other employees. All employees must wear face	

	coverings when entering and exiting the building or using common areas. Businesses must provide materials for employees to make those masks.	
South Carolina	Wear face masks in public.	
South Dakota		Wear a cloth face covering in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.
Tennessee	Some local governments have face mask requirements.	Employees and members of public are encouraged to wear face coverings.
Texas	All re-opening retail workers must wear face coverings.	
Utah	Requires wearing a cloth face covering in any place of public accommodation and reopening businesses during Moderate Risk phase if social distancing is difficult to maintain. Launched free face mask program.	
Vermont	Wear non-medical cloth face coverings when in the presence of others. Retail cashiers may instead use a translucent shield or “sneeze guard”.	
Virginia	Employees working in customer dining and service areas are required to wear face coverings.	Wear a cloth face covering in public.
Washington	Wear cloth face coverings in public places when not eating or drinking.	Wear cloth face coverings in public where the six-foot distance is difficult to maintain.
West Virginia	Personal care services must ensure all employees wear masks. Restaurants must require all employees to wear face coverings at all times.	Small businesses (10 or fewer employees) are recommended to require their employees who have contact with customers to wear a mask and gloves.
Wisconsin		Wear a cloth face covering in public.
Wyoming	Gym employees, personal care services employees and customers are required to wear face coverings.	Wear face masks in congregated areas, such as grocery stores or pharmacies
